Seasonal School "Systems Chemistry" a.y. 2025/26

Art. 1 Seasonal School

Within the framework of the MERITA project, whose objectives include 'the development of innovative and interdisciplinary undergraduate training courses ("seasonal schools") [...] delivered in residential mode at one of the network's centres, in line with MERITA's research themes and characterised by strong integration and synergies aimed at fostering transversal competences', the Scuola Galileiana di Studi Superiori (SGSS) of the University of Padua, in collaboration with the Scuola Normale Superiore (SNS), is organising a Seasonal School entitled "Systems Chemistry". The School will be held in person from 3 to 5 June 2026 in Padua, for a total of 20 teaching hours, corresponding to 3 ECTS credits.

The official language of the School is English.

The Seasonal School will admit a maximum of 50 students.

Art. 2 Educational Objectives

The primary educational objectives of the Seasonal School are to provide an introduction to some of the emerging topics in the field of Chemistry which are not normally covered within Master's degree curricula. By the end of the course, students will have acquired a foundational understanding of the central themes in research on complex chemical systems, including their applications in the areas of molecular machines, responsive materials and information processing with chemical systems.

Art. 3 Admission Requirements and Eligibility Criteria

The course is open to students enrolled at Italian or foreign universities who meet the following requirements:

- Be enrolled in a Master's degree programme in Chemical Sciences, Materials Science and Engineering, Industrial Chemistry and Technology, or in the final two years of the five-year degree programme in Chemistry and Pharmaceutical Technologies, or in a degree



programme at a foreign university equivalent to the above-mentioned Master's degrees, or in a PhD programme in disciplines related to the aforementioned Master's degree programmes;

- Be up to date with the examinations required by their respective degree regulations, with a weighted average mark of at least 27/30 (or equivalent grade average. In the case of applicants who have already graduated, this requirement applies to the overall average mark and to completion within the standard duration of the degree programme).;
- Possess a self-certified knowledge of the English language at a minimum level of B2 (CEFR).

Applicants must meet the above requirements by the application deadline.

Should the number of applications exceed the available places, applications will be assessed according to the following criteria:

- Assessment of the relevance of the applicant's academic record and curriculum vitae to the educational objectives of the School;
- Grade point average (Bachelor's and Master's levels);
- Consistency and excellence of the academic career;
- Documented periods of study abroad;
- Publications.

Art. 4

Organisation of the Course

The course consists of three days, during which a total of five lectures will be delivered by the professors, each lasting four hours:

Art. 5

Application for Admission

Candidates wishing to apply for admission to the Seasonal School must submit their application exclusively online no later than **17 April 2026**, using the dedicated service available at the following website: <https://scuolagalileiana.unipd.it/en/education/seasonal-schools/>

The following documentation must be attached to the application; failure to provide any of the required documents will result in exclusion from the selection procedure:

- A valid identity document;
- Self-certification of English language proficiency at a minimum level of B2 (CEFR);
- Self-certification of enrolment in a Master's degree or PhD programme as specified in Article 3;
- Self-certification of examinations taken during the Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes, including the date and mark obtained, or an official transcript of records;
- Self-certification of the weighted average mark obtained in the examinations taken during the Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes;
- Self-certification of any additional qualifications (documented periods of study abroad; any publications);
- Where applicable, self-certification of enrolment as a student of a University School of Excellence or of a Higher Education Institution with special status.

Applications submitted after the deadline or by means other than those specified in this Article, regardless of the reason, will not be considered.

False statements and declarations are punishable under the Italian Criminal Code and the relevant special laws (Articles 75 and 76 of D.PR. no. 445/2000).

The SGSS reserves the right, at any stage of the procedure, including after the start of the course, to verify the truthfulness of the declarations made and the documents submitted, and to request the production of original documents. In the event of false declarations, the SGSS may, by reasoned decree of the Director, exclude the candidate from the selection procedure, without prejudice to any criminal liability arising therefrom.

Art. 6

Coverage of Participation Costs

All expenses relating to selected students from the Scuola Normale Superiore (SNS) and the Scuola Galileiana di Studi Superiori (SGSS) will be covered by their respective institutions. Other selected participants will be entitled to reimbursement of travel expenses (second-class train tickets purchased through an affiliated travel agency), up to a maximum of €200 (which may be increased to €300 in the case of participants coming from abroad). They will also be provided with board and accommodation, in accordance with the arrangements defined by the organisers, for the period from 3 to 6 June 2026.

Art. 7

Certificate and Academic Credits

Upon completion of the course, 3 ECTS credits will be awarded to participants who attend at least 80% of the scheduled lectures. The award of credits is subject to compliance with the attendance requirements and to passing the planned assessment tests.

Art. 8

Person Responsible for the Selection Procedure and the Processing of Personal Data
